

## LAND REFORM COMMISSION PUBLIC NOTICE

In terms of Section 18 of the Land Reform Commission Act No. 1 of 1972 (Amended from time to time), those who have submitted their statutory declarations but up to now;

- Not have their or their heirs' names published in the Gazette having surveyed and demarcated the lands, from the effective date of the said Act up to the present, for the statutory decision, in terms of Section 19 of the Act.
- Declarent's children of the age of 18 or above at the effective date of the Act, parents or their heirs who have been granted approval to obtain lands, as transfer within the family, under Section 14 of the Act.
- Persons or their heirs who have owned agricultural land extents below the maximum limit allowed, those had their private land transferred to the commission and as a result entitled to claim alternate land under Section 22(1) 'E' of the Act,
- Should complete the detailed leaflet, obtained either from the Head Office or the Director of the District Lands Commission Board of Authority or downloaded from the **www.lrc.gov.lk** Website, and placed in the special letter box kept at the Head Office of Land Reform Commission at the address below or sent by registered post to the undermentioned address or by email **lrc.legal.obligations@gmail.com** and request to obtain a special number on or before 31st May 2023. It is further informed that after the said date, requests made to obtain lands as legal liability, shall not be considered.
